

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FOREWORD

The Robert P. and Norma J. Puddester Collections (the Puddester Collection) of coins, medals and tokens of British India, the Independent Empires and Princely States is being sold in a series of Noonan auctions over the next few years. Norma concentrated on the Sikh Empire and Feudatory states, the Maratha Confederacy, several north-western states and Sikh temple tokens while Robert concentrated on the East India Company, the other Princely States, medals and tokens.

dabbled in collecting just about everything before becoming fascinated by the coins, medals and tokens of the East India Company and its era. Then followed the historical medals and tokens and everything British India, the Princely States and the orders, decorations and military awards, until I was collecting everything connected with the metallic world of the British period in India except what my wife was collecting – together we covered it all.

Connoisseurs will note that the coins in this collection are originals, not restrikes. The few restrikes in the collection are there for a reason: they were especially singled out by Pridmore and given a specific reference number by him, or otherwise are especially noteworthy.

Collectors will also note that none of the coins in this sale are encapsulated. That was my decision. I am not a fan of encapsulation and a few of the coins that were encapsulated have been removed so that they could be examined properly. Of all the series of milled coins, British India deserves close observation of the surfaces and edges. We also have in Peter Preston-Morley a conservative cataloguer par excellence, who handled and viewed many thousands of British India coins in the 1980s heyday of the series long before encapsulation, including the entire Pridmore and other large, specialized collections, and who is thoroughly familiar with the series. A cataloguer cannot do his or her job properly if coins are encapsulated.

I pay particular attention to condition, and I am interested in obtaining the highest grade and most attractive specimen of each coin. This is especially true for the mohurs of William IV and Victoria, and it took me many years to put together the gold element of the collection in the high quality you see in this catalogue. **R.P.P.**

My first interest in seriously collecting coins dates to the early 1980s, when I became interested in Canadian trade dollars and then Canadian communion tokens, of which I now have a nearly complete collection with specimens from Norweb, Noble, Henderson, Baker and other well-known collections.

When I moved to India in 1984, I became extremely interested in the coins of the Sikh Empire. As described in Part I of this series of sales I had some great teachers, the late Ken Wiggins and Stan Goron, who had together written the standard Sikh text at the time and who were coincidently staying at our house in Delhi and helped me get started. In addition to the Sikhs proper I had a growing interest in the Cis Sutlej states and other states in northwestern India, specifically Kashmir, and the Rajputana states of Bharatpur, Bundi and the Independent Kingdom of Farrukhabad. These collections led to the Maratha Confederacy which I also now very actively collect.

After almost completing collections in the rupees and fractions I now tend to look for the rarer mohurs and fractions, double rupees and nazarana rupees which are naturally much harder to find. Along the way I have assembled a fascinating group of gold temple tokens of the Sikhs

he second part of the Puddester collection focuses on the uniform coinage of British India – firstly under the East India Company from 1835, and then issues of the Government of India from 1858 until independence in 1947.

As with Part I, the cataloguing follows Pridmore's order of numbering, with a few exceptions.

Among the 1,181 coins in this sale are some superb treasures from both sides of the 1858 divide. Not least among them is one of the very few currency issue double-mohurs of William IV now extant (lot 908), the exceptional 'specimen' mohur which graces the front cover of the catalogue (lot 911) and, as one of many of Fred Pridmore's coins purchased by the cataloguer for Bob in 1983, his 1854 silver proof mohur (lot 916). Other rarities were gathered from various sales in the 1980s, a superb original 1849 pattern set (lot 954) being just one such.

Of course, pre-dating these are the series of pattern rupees inspired by the original efforts of James Prinsep, some of which incorporated John Flaxman's classic lion and palm design (lots 1025-31). These conclude with the exceptionally rare 1835-dated Bombay rupee and half-rupee (lots 1033-4), a pair brought together by Dr Archibald Brushfield (1870-1960) at least 100 years ago, kept together by Pridmore and Bob and, in a nice touch, sharing the same page in this catalogue.

The Government section opens with a superb date run of gold mohurs, from the frozen date 1862 issues through to 1891. Here you'll find a wonderful original 1862 Proof (lot 1047), as well as two original 1870 Proof 10 Rupees, one of which has only had two owners since 1951 (lots 1063–4). A simply stunning 1860 pattern (lot 1066) heads the extensive rupee series, which also features an exceptionally rare 1863 Proof Pattern (lot 1108); with the quirky dating system employed on Indian coinage at the time, this is the only 1863-dated Indian coin that exists, so a real prize for the connoisseur. Moving into the 20th century, other pieces that are also bound to be highly prized are the unique original 1903 rupee struck in gold (lot 1191), and the finest known experimental rupee of 1939 with a security edge (lot 1229), which in itself is the rarest British India currency coin.

As Bob remarks elsewhere, his passion for acquiring coins in top quality is amply reflected throughout the Government series, and especially for the half-rupee, which always was a difficult denomination to find in close to mint state back in the day and is even more so now. The half-rupees in this catalogue are undoubtedly the best such assembly ever grouped in one place; they include an 1877 (lot 1240) and a 1906 (lot 1280) in unmatched quality. The smaller silver denominations feature almost all the key dates and are worthy of careful scrutiny, as is the quality of the copper and bronze, while some of the nickel-alloy issues of the 1920s are almost unknown in EF or better condition, as intensively circulated as they were; many of these here are the best that any collector will find.

The auction concludes with issues of the princely states authorized under the Native Coinage Act of 1876 – Alwar, Bikanir, Dewas (both branches), Dhar and Sailana – and then the patterns, featuring three original rupees of Edward VII that used to belong to the artist A.P. Spencer (lots 1640–2), a range of original annas from the days of early experiments with alternative coinage metals (lots 1643–8) and, last but certainly not least, a highly important and previously unpublished series of eight patterns of George VI dated 1946 by Patrick Brindley (lots 1649–55).

Bob and most of his contemporaries in the world of collecting British Colonial coins spurn the issues surrounding encapsulation, and with good reason. They prefer their coins to speak for themselves; for the collector to truly appreciate a top-quality coin it should remain in its raw state, to be handled with the care and respect afforded it by past guardians. It is for this reason that Bob and I urge prospective buyers to come and see the coins in the flesh – there is simply no better substitute than your own eyes and a good magnifying glass.

It has been an honour for me to relive a long professional and personal relationship with Bob while cataloguing his unrivalled collection of E.I.C. and British India coins. This is the second of a historic series of auctions that will be references in their own right for decades to come. Those who acquire Puddester coins, whether from this or subsequent sales, will own pieces to be rightly proud of, in the knowledge that they rank among the finest, if not the best known. Take the opportunity now — many pieces in this collection only appear in the marketplace once in a generation, if that. Take the same initiative that Bob did and, like him and their previous owners, you will have some wonderful and historic coins to enjoy.

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The East India Company and its uniform coinage, 1835-1858

The move towards a uniform coinage for all the East India Company's possessions, which had been mooted in the I790s as the more advanced of the country's mints moved slowly towards mechanisation, resulted in a statement of intent from the Court of Directors in I806. But it was not until I833, when the Bengal presidency equalized the value of the differing rupees in circulation and introduced a standard comparable with the rupees in Madras and Bombay, that real progress could be made.

The architect of the new uniform coinage was James Prinsep (1799-1840), Assay Master at Calcutta. The workaholic seventh son of an East India merchant, Prinsep's project for reforming weights and measures was adopted and, in November 1833, he recommended that the Mint Committee appoint a native engraver, Kasinath Dass. Working under the guidance of Prinsep, already by this time a keen numismatist, and to Prinsep's designs, specimens of Dass' first efforts of a new rupee were submitted to the Calcutta Mint Committee on 6 April 1834. Despite the unfortunate crack which the obverse die suffered, perhaps as a result of the thickness of the flan, the Committee was satisfied as to Dass' skill-set and, following Prinsep's suggestion to equate the dimension of the rupee to the U.S. half-dollar, a number of patterns were executed and submitted to authority. An excellent group of these is included in this auction, demonstrating the thinking behind the design elements chosen. The final model, pairing the head of the monarch with the mark of value in English and Persian, was approved in April 1835; at the same time it was decreed that the year need not be changed until there was a change of type, hence coins being dated 1835 struck into the mid-1840s, coins dated 1840 and 1841 minted up to 1848, and those dated 1849 coined as late as 1862.

At the same time, Prinsep masterminded the reform of the copper coinage, suggesting that it retained the Company's armorial bearings as a design element. New designs were accordingly prepared while Act XVII, dated 17 August 1835, ratified the change in the coinage across the Company's possessions. Two weeks later the first of the new silver coins entered circulation, followed in December 1835 by the first copper quarter-annas and, on New Year's Day 1836, the new gold mohur and double-mohur.

While Calcutta remained the dominant mint at this period, reacting to orders from London and supplying matrix dies and puncheons to Bombay and Madras (the latter re-opening in July 1837), relations between officials at the different mints were often strained because of the lack of working tools. This situation was exacerbated by the accession of Victoria and the time taken to prepare new dies, and it was not until late 1840 that the first Victorian rupees were struck, with gold mohurs following in February 1841. In January 1847 the Court of Directors, acting on a plea from officials at Calcutta, ordered new matrix dies from London, but these were not received until December 1849 and the first coins from them appeared in July 1850.

During the early years of uniformity, Calcutta and Madras struck copper coins to the new designs, but Bombay continued with its design incorporating a pair of scales, first introduced in 1830 (Puddester part I, lot 465 et seq.). It was not until December 1843 that Bombay requested new dies, and as a result Act XXII, 1844, restricted the copper denominations to one uniform type.

Concurrent with increasing unrest throughout India with the wars in the Sutlej and Punjab in the late 1840s, the North West Frontier in the 1850s and the annexation of Oudh in 1856, which in turn led to the Indian Mutiny, there was an increasing demand for copper coins which local mints were unable to fulfill. Plans were put in place for a new copper mint at Calcutta, but in the meantime the Company had to resort to ordering quarter-annas from the independent Birmingham mints of Ralph Heaton & Sons and James Watt & Co, who between them supplied five tranches of coin between 1857 and 1862. These were the final coinages authorised by the E.I.C. before the government of India passed to the Crown on I November 1858, yet coins issued from Birmingham and the three Indian mints continued to bear designs and title of the Company until I November 1862.

Robert Gordon's interpretation of Peter Rouw's model of John Flaxman's classic design for a new Indian coinage, executed in 1823 (see Puddester I, lot 562), was subsequently utilised by Kasinath Dass, whose dual appointment at the Calcutta mint as Head Die Cutter and Copper Plate Engraver was confirmed on 1 May 1834. Matrices and punches for the proposed reform of the coinage were prepared in the summer of 1834 and pattern rupees submitted to the Mint Master, Robert Saunders (1792-1856), and the Mint Committee. These patterns depicted Flaxman's lion as the obverse, paired with a value-in-wreath reverse (Prid. 171; see Lot 1026), but Saunders and his committee reported at the end of March 1835 that the new coins had to feature the head of the reigning monarch on the obverse and either Flaxman's lion or the value expressed on the reverse. Further minor amendments to the designs were implemented in the summer of 1835, preparatory to the adoption of Act XVII, 17 August 1835, which authorised the coinage changes throughout India. After some initial objections to the featuring of an animal on the reverses of the new gold coins, Sir Charles Metcalfe (1785-1846), the acting Governor-General, ordered that Flaxman's lion be adopted and so dies were prepared in December 1835 and the first mohurs and double-mohurs entered circulation on New Year's Day, 1836. By the end of 1837 only 1,174 double-mohurs had been struck, of which perhaps 20 exist today, many in institutional collections; the coin is far more frequently encountered in commerce as a proof restrike

Mohurs without the signature of a mint master on the truncation of the bust have generally been given to Bombay in the past on account of there being no sede vacante in that position at Calcutta at the time these coins were struck (cf. Pridmore p.27 and lot 8, Wheeler lot 200). However, the inclusion of a stop to the right of the date on the Wheeler coin, and others noted (Fore III, 2454, Album 35, 335) would seem to infer strongly that they are Calcutta mint products, as noted by Stevens and Weir. It seems a possibility that the very first currency mohurs struck at Calcutta lack initials on the truncation, in the manner of the majority of the extant 1834-5 patterns

In 1846 the Court of Directors of the E.I.C., reacting to a request from William Forbes at Calcutta for the appointment of a competent Europeantrained engraver to the Mint staff, countered by asking for a supply of dies and matrices from William Wyon. The first of these were received in Calcutta in December 1849, but problems with the convexity of the reverse dies when paired with obverses meant that Kasinath Das had to copy Wyon's originals. The first coins of the new types, with divided obverse legends, were struck in July 1850

A further order of dies, matrices and puncheons by the Company for a gold coinage in four denominations, originally placed before the death of William Wyon in October 1851, was completed by his son, Leonard Charles Wyon (1826-91). The work, entrusted not to the Royal Mint but to the London firm of John Pinches, took most of the latter half of 1853, and mindful of that Wyon instructed that the obverse dies be dated 1854 (Attwood, pp.324-5). Despite the work costing the Company over £380, the dies were never used in India contemporaneously and almost all 1854-dated coins encountered are proof restrikes

Following the rejection by authorities of Kasinath Dass'! rst patterns for a rupee, measuring 26.5mm and submitted in April 1834 (Prid. 168-9, not represented in this collection), James Prinsep (1799-1840), Assay Master at Calcutta, proposed a larger coin equivalent in size to the US half-dollar. Following Bentinck's wish to see designs incorporating other devices (see footnote to previous lot), sketches were submitted for his approval on 2 January 1835. These included the head of the monarch with the simple legend 'William III King' (see next lot), and Flaxman's lion and palm. Bentinck favoured using the latter for the obverse of the new rupee, coupled with the reverse approved the previous October. Dies were completed in March 1835 and Robert Saunders submitted specimens to the Mint Committee on 25 March; these were then forwarded to the new acting Governor-General, Sir Charles Metcalfe (1785-1846), on 31 March. Comparing these with rupees bearing the head of William IV, Metcalfe and his Mint Committee overturned Bentinck's opinion on the suitability of the lion and palm for the obverse and instead requested that it be utilised as the reverse of a proposed new gold double-mohur (see Lot 1)

After Metcalfe had approved the new designs as the model for the future coinage of rupees in early April 1835, further instructions were received to the effect that the value was to be expressed only in English and Persian, the date 1835 was to be frozen until further notice and the word 'King' was to be omitted. In an attempt to reduce their dependency on Calcutta for matrix dies, officers at the Bombay mint appear to have engaged a native of Cutch to engrave dies for a rupee and matrix dies for a half-rupee (see next Lot). Specimens of both coins were submitted to the Mint Committee on 24 December 1836, but the Bombay government, on seeking permission from Calcutta to strike coins from them, were refused and advised that they must use matrices supplied by the Calcutta mint. The suggestion that the initials MD represent the artist Jean-Baptiste Merlen [Designer], first alluded to by the cataloguer of the Murdoch collection and copied by several sources since, is doubtless fanciful; far more plausible is the suggestion put forward by Paul Stevens that they represent the talented Bombay mint engineer, Capt Frederick McGillivray (1801-38), Bombay Engineers, and the then Bombay Mint Master, Bazette Doveton (1788-1848)

The pieces in this and the following 10 lots cannot rightly be described as patterns or trials as they are modern-day creations (probably made in the 1970s), uniface, and not intended to duplicate past issues, but presumably were made for a Bombay collector, from whose collection they came. Likely unofficially made at the Bombay mint, they may be best described as fantasy pieces. The centrepiece is a representation of Flaxman's original lion and palm-tree design, which differs from renditions by Robert Gordon (Bombay mint), Kasinath Dass (Calcutta mint) and William Wyon (London and Calcutta) in numerous details, most noticeably in the right front leg of the lion not reaching the plinth and the fact that the tree trunk is missing. The lion's body is excessively pitted, unlike any other strikes, trial or otherwise, by either mint

The uniform coinage of British India, 1858-1947

In the wake of the British government passing the Government of India Act on 2 August 1858, transfer of power to the Crown was completed on I November, when a Durbar at Allahabad proclaimed Victoria ruler of the sub-continent. Importantly, the old East India Company policy of political unification through princely state annexation was reversed, and princes were left free to adopt any heirs they desired so long as they all swore undying allegiance to the British crown.

Regardless of the political upheaval, coins issued from Birmingham and the three Indian mints continued to bear designs and titles of the East India Company until I November 1862, while it is clear that 1841-dated gold coins of the type first introduced in 1850-I continued to be struck into the mid-1860s. In early 1859 James Cosmo Melvill (1821-80), the newly-appointed assistant Under-Secretary of State for India, requested Sir Charles Trevelyan, KCB (1807-86) at the Treasury to authorise the Royal Mint in London to prepare matrices and punches for each of the denominations then in use. Leonard Wyon prepared the required tools for the silver and copper coins, selecting a crowned Gothic-style effigy of the Queen and, on the copper coins, discarding the Company's arms and substituting a mark of value. Wyon's matrices and tools were regarded by some officials in India as the work of a medallist, rather than a coinengraver, and consistently failed to meet the technical requirements deemed necessary by the Calcutta and other mints, so new matrices had to be prepared.

These delays meant that the first of the new government coinages, in silver and copper, were not issued until November 1862. The habit of 'era-dating', which had its origins in the 1835-dated series, was continued with until January 1874, while, after the closure of the Madras mint in 1869, behind the scenes a cypher system was proposed to differentiate the products of Calcutta and Bombay, which came to nothing. Eventually, distinguishing marks in the form of small letters C and B shared the stage with tiny beads or pellets, a practice that continued until Independence.

The appointment of Victoria as Empress of India in May 1876 saw little change to the coinage, except in respect of her title and for the discontinuation of the cumbersome half-anna. All the old pre-1835 Company coinages were called in while the stability of silver in relation to gold underwent much change. As a silver-standard country, India coined more rupees than the economy demanded and their exchange value decreased, so much so that minting ceased in 1893 and was not resumed for four years. India was finally placed on a gold exchange standard in 1899, but there remained little domestic demand for a gold coinage until 1917.

With the coming of the 20th century there was a phased withdrawal of the last of the EIC post-1835 silver coins, though the contemporary copper remained unburdened by such officialdom. Edward VII's coinage bore the uncrowned head of the King on the whim of the Viceroy, Lord Curzon (1859-1925), who was impressed with the efforts of F.K. Wezel at the Calcutta mint, but a series of changes begun in 1903 with the new nickel-based coinages witnessed the introduction of a crowned head; regular issues remained unchanged, despite bronze replacing copper in 1906. The commencement of George V's reign was marred by the bazaar rumour claiming that the new rupee depicted a pig, quickly causing its withdrawal; of far greater numismatic importance was the effect of the Great War on the currency, which saw gold reserves turned into bullion in the form of sovereigns and 15-rupee pieces and the price of silver soared, bringing the considerable minting of rupees to a halt in 1923; half- and quarter-rupees were to appear spasmodically along with the new nickel 8- and 4-annas.

The first coins of George VI featured a high-relief effigy, replaced towards the close of 1939 by a portrait of less fine workmanship. With the coming of War a form of security edge on the silver coins, to deter counterfeiting, was introduced. Coin production was ramped up to such an extent that a new mint was constructed at Lahore and Pretoria struck bronze pice; had the SS *Tilwa* not been torpedoed there would also have been a silver coinage from South Africa. The last major coins issued prior to Independence on 15 August 1947 featured the Indian tiger, some patterns for which are included in this auction.

Leonard Wyon prepared the required tools for the silver and copper coins, selecting a crowned Gothic-style effigy of the Queen and, on the copper coins, discarding the Company's arms and substituting a mark of value. On arrival in India it was found that Wyon's matrices failed to meet the technical requirements deemed necessary by the Calcutta and other mints, so new matrices were prepared at Calcutta. No provision in all this, however, had been made for the coinage of gold, which actually was not legal tender at the time, nor was any allowance made for gold in Act XIII, 23 April 1862, when the new silver and copper coins were formally announced. Gold continued to be coined at Calcutta from metal supplied by private individuals and merchants, some of which was coming from the new discoveries in California and Australia, but evidently the pre-1858 mohur designs were used well into the mid-1860s. The imperial design, on coins with the fixed date 1862, is believed to have been first adopted on gold coins in December 1866 (Pridmore, p.102)

The quantity of gold being brought to the Calcutta mint for coinage in the years up to 1892 was relatively insignificant, as the mintage figures for mohurs of the period 1877-92 attest. The government, however, intended to replace mohurs with imperial sovereigns, imported from the UK and Australia, and to this effect the coining of mohurs ceased, but it was not until Act XXII, 1899, that the currency of British India changed from the rupee to the sovereign. Although the question of coining sovereigns at Bombay had been raised in 1912, it was not until the effects of the Great War and the rise in the price of silver in 1916-17 that the Indian government was minded to strike gold. On 14 June 1918 a new gold mohur, tariffed at 15 rupees and equivalent in weight to the sovereign, was announced, but coining ostensibly ceased on 15 August with the introduction of the new I-marked sovereigns (see Lot 1061). In any event, Act IV, 1927, declared gold coin no longer legal tender in India from 1 April 1927

The Royal Mint facility within the Bombay mint compound was headed by James Thomas Becklake (1880-1965), previously in charge of the cutting room at the Royal Mint in London, and Raoul Robellaz Kahan (1883-1952), seconded from the assay department at the Perth mint in Australia. Despite the difficulties caused by the Spanish influenza pandemic in the city, which Kahan caught and caused him to be off work for five weeks, the branch mint struck a total of 1,296,033 sovereigns between 15 August and 6 December. Staffing problems led to the closure of it in April 1919, but not before it had additionally coined almost two million half-rupees and a large quantity of cupro-nickel 1 annas in the early months of that year; the building, known today as Mint House, still stands. On 30 June 1859 the Treasury in London authorised the Master of the Royal Mint, Thomas Graham (1805-69), to procure matrices and punches for the new Imperial coinages. He in turn instructed Leonard Wyon, who selected a crowned Gothic-style effigy of the Queen, perhaps drawing on the influence of the numismatist Richard Sainthill (1787-1869), who had favoured using such a portrait on Indian coins as far back as 1846. By the end of 1859 Wyon had penned some designs, including one with a coronetted head (Attwood, p.326), which was not proceeded with. Once the designs for the new coins had been approved Wyon set to work, and by 12 November 1860 a tiny number of pattern rupees had been struck, most of which appear to have been piédforts (cf. Fore II, 803). Two weeks later the new coin received royal approval and Wyon spent much of the first half of 1861 making matrices and puncheons for the different denominations. These were shipped to Calcutta in August 1861 and trial strikes produced, but because the tools did not meet the technical requirements of the local mints new matrices were prepared in Calcutta by using Wyon's punches and partial re-engraving (Pridmore, p.52). Act XIII, 23 April 1862, authorised the new coinage, which was first issued from Calcutta, Bombay and Madras on 1 November 1862. While Bombay and Calcutta struck coins bearing the frozen date 1862 throughout the period 1862-74, when a more normal dating system was introduced, Madras only remained operational until May 1869; the mint there closed on 14 August and its machinery sold to the state of Hyderabad (Pridmore, p.53)

Although the *Times of India* had published an article on the subject as early as 1893, the purpose of the dots or pellets found on some 1862-dated rupees was not generally known to numismatists in the western world until Henry Garside explained the dating sequence (*SNC* February 1914, cols. 95-6). Erich Wodak built on this research (*South Australian Numismatic Journal*, April 1957), but extensive work undertaken over several years by George Falcke and Robert Clarke, originally published in the August and September 1970 issues of *Coins* magazine and reprinted as *India's 1862 Rupees* (Iola, 1971), remains the defining study

As the matrices sent by the Royal Mint in 1861 proved unsatisfactory for normal use, even after modification by local engravers Kasinath Dass and Johannes Lutz, the Secretary of State for India, Sir Charles Wood (1800-85), persuaded Thomas Graham, Master of the Mint, to have L.C. Wyon alter the obverse die of the rupee and prepare a double set of tools for each of the Indian mints. A tiny number of 1863-dated rupees, depicting the effigy of Victoria in slightly lower relief and other minor detail differences, were struck in London prior to the tools being despatched to India. Neither Calcutta nor Madras used the revised matrix; Bombay, run by Lt-Col John Archibald Ballard (1829-80) did, but it proved troublesome and a further request was made for a replacement from London in 1864. More tools were supplied in the wake of a few patterns being struck in London (Prid. 107; not in this collection), but the situation was little-remedied until the visit of Lt-Col Henry Hyde (1824-87), Master of the Calcutta mint, to the Royal Mint in May 1867. Hyde, who considered Wyon a medallist rather than a coin engraver, was critical of the latter's high-relief work and suggested that re-modelling would result in increased output per die and save expenditure. Nevertheless, Graham persisted with Wyon, who produced a small number of 1867-dated coins in London (Prid. 108-9; cf. Fore II, 809) before the tools were sent to Calcutta in March 1868 (Prid. 110; cf. Fore II, 810)



As authorities at the India Office and the Royal Mint in London were dissatisfied with patterns produced by the Calcutta mint engraver F.K. Wezel in the summer of 1901 (see Lots 1640-1), and officials in England and India could not agree, alternative designs were produced. Eventually a compromise was reached whereby the uncrowned head of the new monarch would be paired with a new reverse chosen by the India Office and approved by Edward in April 1902. Matrices and punches were sent to Calcutta in July 1902, but both were found unsuitable and new obverse matrices had to be prepared in September, on which the legend was divided around the king's head, before coinage of rupees could commence. The first of the new coins entered circulation on 1 January 1903

The obverse punch for the new coinage of George V, showing the king wearing the Imperial Crown, Robe of State, collars of the Orders of the Star of India and Indian Empire and the badge of the Order of the Bath, was received by the Calcutta mint in July 1911. This was paired with the new reverse engraved from a design by Percy Brown (1872-1955), head of the Government School of Art, Calcutta, and accordingly stocks of the new coins, in silver and bronze, were built up in preparation for their release into circulation on 12 December 1911, the day of the Delhi Durbar. Unfortunately, political agitators in the bazaars started a rumour that a 'pig' was depicted on the new rupee, claiming that the elephant's body and legs on the collar chain of the Star of India were out of proportion, no tusks were visible and the short trunk looked like a pig's snout. Among Muslims and certain other religious sects the pig is an unclean animal and public aversion to the coin was swift and hostile. The government was left with no option but to announce on 23 January 1912 that the rupee, of which some 700,000 had been issued, was to be withdrawn, and notices were placed in the *Times of India* to that effect (Garside, *SNC* March 1912, cols. 13455-6). Poor engraving of the design was to blame for the confusion; the image on the smaller denominations had not caused offence and most of these remained in circulation. Continued pressure on silver stocks caused the Indian government to amend the Coinage Act of 1906, and in March 1940 quarter-rupees to the quaternary standard (.500 fine) were authorised, followed by half-rupees in July 1940 and rupees in December 1940. At the same time the government moved to adopt the recommendation of Bombay for the introduction of a security edge on silver coins, but difficulties with the techniques and processes meant that staff from the Royal Mint in London had to supervise the initial production. Rupees were the first Indian coins to feature security edges.

The 1939-dated rupees with security edges have always been regarded as one of the famed prizes in Indian numismatics. Very few specimens, almost certainly less than 10, are known, and in the past decades could come and go without a single specimen appearing on the market. Exceptionally, this is the second such coin to be offered at auction this year! A specimen with the extremely unflattering third-party grade of 'AU Details – Corrosion Harshly Cleaned' realised US \$42,000 at the Stack's auction held in conjunction with the 2024 NYINC, while another specimen with an acceptable third-party grade of VF-30 realised £23,000 in a Baldwin auction in September 2010; previously it had sold for a mere \$310 at a Bowers & Ruddy auction in Los Angeles (9-11 February 1978, lot 4060). The present specimen is far superior to both of these and represents an exceptional opportunity for the advanced collector of British India coins

During the early part of the War it became apparent that the existing minting capacity at Bombay and Calcutta was unable to keep up with demand, so the decision was taken to establish a third mint south of Calcutta, at Alipore. With the foundations and superstructure constructed, the threat of a Japanese invasion led to the removal of the superstructure and building materials in March 1942 to a new site at Lahore, 250 miles distant. Construction at Lahore began in May 1942 and the first coins were produced in October 1943; the location of the mint caused it to fall under the jurisdiction of Pakistan after independence

In the wake of advances by the Japanese and the need for economy in metal stocks during 1942, the Indian government authorised the issue of a new pice (quarter-anna) with a large central hole. The first of these coins, struck at Bombay, entered circulation on 1 February 1943; later that same year a concurrent issue, struck at the Pretoria mint in South Africa and with trifling differences in the design, was authorised. Between 1943 and 1947 a total of 1.46 billion pice were struck by the four active mints, Bombay, Calcutta, Lahore and Pretoria, a phenomenal modern coinage for the time. Pretoria had also been engaged to strike silver coins, but 60 tons of silver bars being transported from Bombay to South Africa on the SS *Tilawa* was lost when the vessel was torpedoed by a Japanese submarine on 23 November 1942, with the loss of 280 lives. The silver bars, recovered in 2017, were claimed by the South African government under 'sovereign' rights





Despite an ostensibly large mintage of cupro-nickel 2 annas, annas and half-annas at Lahore in 1946, coins that have been attributed to that mint by Pridmore (SNC October 1977, pp.419-21), on account of the fact that they have a relief diamond or 'pyramis' on the surface of one or both sides, have proved decidedly difficult to locate. In 2015 Dinyar Madon (JONS 225, pp.36-9) illustrated a selection of such pieces and discounted Pridmore's original theory on the basis that these marks are also found on coins that can be conclusively proved to be products of the mints at Bombay and Calcutta. The real purpose of the marks, an artefact of the minting process, was exposed by Henk Groenendijk in 2016 (JONS 227, p.31)

The state of Alwar, in Rajputana, was established in the early part of the 1770s under the rule of Pratap Singh. In the wake of the Indian Mutiny and the death of the then ruler, Bani Singh, his 12-year old son, Sheodan Singh (1845-74) succeeded to the title but the state was ruled by a council of regency until his coming-of-age in 1863. Further internal strife removed Sheodan from power in 1870 and a second ruling council was appointed. British copper coinage was introduced to the state in 1873 and Sheodan died in October 1874 without leaving any descendants. The council, under its president Major Thomas Cadell, VC (1835-1919), appointed 15-year old Mangal Singh (1859-92), who was invested with regal powers in the wake of Victoria becoming Empress of India in 1877. Mangal was the first chief to take advantage of the Native Coinage Act, passed on 28 March 1876, and was advanced to Maharajah on the occasion of Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887. He died suddenly in May 1892.

Mangal ordered 200,000 rupees from the Calcutta mint and coining commenced in November 1877, but, due to an error by Johannes Lutz, the Mint engraver, the last three Arabic numerals of the date were wrongly engraved on the master die. Some 150,000 pieces were returned to the Mint for recoinage in succeeding months and it is believed that very few specimens entered circulation

Established as a state in the second half of the 15th century, the rulers of Bikanir, in Rajputana, became vassals of the emperors of Delhi. The state came under British influence in 1817 and Sardar Singh (1818-72), the Maharajah at the time of the Indian Mutiny, assisted the British, to be rewarded with additional territory in 1862. Further local insurrections led to increased British involvement and his adopted heir Dungar Singh (1854-87) was succeeded by Dungar's adopted brother, 7-year old Ganga Singh (1880-1943), who came of age in 1898.

Bikanir applied for the substitution of silver and copper coins struck in a British mint for its then existing currency in September 1890. The proposal being accepted, an agreement was drawn up and the necessary dies prepared. The Darbar proceeded to call in its silver coins and despatch them to the Bombay mint, where they were recoined as rupees which became legal tender in British India; similarly the copper coins were sent to Calcutta where they were recoined. The number of rupees coined for the state was 707,072 (102,030 in 1892-3, 493,836 in 1893-4 and 111,206 in 1897-8), while that of copper quarter-annas and half-pice totalled 6.65 million, all of which were struck in 1894-5

Dewas, a Maratha city-state located in central India, was given to two brothers, Tukoji Rao and Jiwaji Rao, in 1726, as a reward for army services. The brothers divided the territory among themselves; their descendants ruled respectively as the senior and junior branches of the family, with increased British influence after 1818. From 1841 each branch ruled its own portion as a separate state, distinguished by Europeans as the senior and junior branches. Despite this, the lands belonging to each branch were intimately entangled; in Dewas city, the two sides of the main street were under different administrations and had different arrangements for water supply and lighting. Krishnaji Rao II (1849-99), the adopted son of Rukmangad Rao (1821-60) succeeded at the age of 11, but his reign of the senior branch was not a great success from an economic standpoint. The sixth rajah of the junior branch, Narayan Rao (1860-92), was only 3 years old when he succeeded his father in August 1864

The Dhar state dynasty was founded in 1729. During the Pindhari raids the state's territory was reduced, but restored in January 1819 after an alliance agreement with the East India Company, after which it came under indirect British rule. The state was confiscated after the Mutiny, but in 1860 restored to Raja Anand Rao III Pawar (1844-98), then a minor, with the exception of the detached district of Bairusia which was granted to the Begum of Bhopal. Anand Rao, who received the personal title Maharajah and the KCSI in 1877, died in 1898

Sailana state was founded by Raja Jai Singh in 1715, with the city of that name being built in 1736. Following his death in 1757, the state was governed by a number of weak rulers, with much of the territory annexed by the Scinds of Gwalior. In 1819 the tribute payments to Gwalior were reduced to a third of the state's revenue; later the tribute was paid directly to the British administration to support troops in the region. Jaswant Singh II (1864-1919), who succeeded his adopted father, Dule Singh (c. 1838-95) in October 1895, proved to be a reforming ruler, working with the British to overcome poverty, corruption and famine

Following the death of Queen Victoria, coins struck throughout 1901 for circulation continued to bear her effigy and titles. Behind the scenes, preparation was being made for a redesign of the coinage, and the Calcutta mint engraver F.K. Wezel prepared two patterns for the new rupee, believed to have been completed by July 1901. Specimens of both types were despatched from Calcutta to the India Office in London, which passed them on to the Royal Mint for comment. The Mint criticised almost every part of the design except for the tiger and the inscriptions in Persian and Nagri script, and wondered why the Victorian reverse design had not been continued with. Conceding that the obverse legend could be changed, authorities in India sought to submit Wezel's designs to the King for his opinion, but events in London took a turn when the Viceroy requested that the uncrowned head of the King as used on the gold sovereign be used for the Indian coinage. The King agreed to that, but he preferred a newly-prepared Calcutta reverse design, and accordingly work was put in hand in the summer of 1902

Following developments in some of India's minor coinage denominations from 1904, and a move to incorporate the crowned head of the monarch, a few 1907 pattern rupees were struck (Prid. 1048: not in this collection). A complication arose, in that the 1902 version of the King's officially-approved crowned effigy for coinage, where he was shown wearing the insignia of the Order of the Garter and of the Order of the Bath, was not strictly appropriate for India. Sir Guy Douglas Arthur Fleetwood Wilson (1850-1940), a member of the Governor-General's Council and head of the department responsible for the control of mints, is believed to have overseen the introduction of a new effigy bearing the collars of the Order of the Star of India and the Order of the Indian Empire. This was then paired with a new reverse by Percy Brown (1872-1955), but the death of Edward VII prevented its adoption, although the reverse was subsequently utilised for the coinage of George V (see Lot 1204)

XRF analysis shows the metal content as 90% nickel, 9% light elements, with traces of cobalt, copper and iron. Although experimentation in coining patterns in nickel had been undertaken at the Bombay mint at the end of the 19th century, it was not until 1903 that the practice was restarted, and then at Calcutta. It had been suggested that the new coin, to be valued at 1 anna (a denomination not then in circulation), should have a special distinguishing feature to distinguish it from the smaller silver coins then in use, and a central perforation or an unusual shape was suggested. Of the two choices, the government of the day preferred a perforated coin, but this would preclude a successful portrayal of the monarch, as evidenced by the Andaman Islands rupee tokens of the 1860s. To overcome this, the obverse design was modelled upon the letter E (Edward), and several variants were made between 1903 and 1905. The preferred choice (Prid. 1057: not in this collection) was sent to England in March 1905 for royal approval. Edward objected to the omission of his effigy and suggested the central perforation be moved to accommodate it. The technical difficulties of making such a coin delayed any speedy prospect of a new anna being issued. The Mint Master at Calcutta, Capt A.L.C. McCormick, CIE, noted that the King had not expressed a wish for a perforated coin, only that his image be on it. He accordingly sent to London drawings for the obverse of a coin with a scalloped edge, together with some scalloped nickel blanks, the drawings being copied from the Straits Settlements quarter-cent, the matrix for which was held by the Calcutta mint. These met with favour and McCormick set to work, trialling flans with differing numbers of scallops; while in temporary charge at the Bombay mint in October and November 1906, he undertook an experimental coinage of 12-sided cupro-nickel annas (Prid. 925, but see footnote to Lot 1646). Specimens were sent to London for royal approval, which was granted on 31 January 1907

Encouraged by the favourable reception given to the new cupro-nickel annas in 1907, the government proceeded to plan for an issue of comparable half-annas, a denomination which had not been struck in any great quantities since the late 1870s. To this end, a few patterns were struck in 1908. Consultation with local authorities, however, led to a decision not to proceed until the population had become thoroughly familiar with the new annas, and the subsequent death of the monarch led to the initiative being quietly dropped

In 1945 the Indian government came under pressure to introduce a new coin for use by the poor which was lower in value than the current half-pice. The result, produced in less than a week, involved making a bronze coin from the redundant metallic centre of the then-current pice, but it was deemed impractical and very few were ever struck. 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- (c) to re-sell the lot or cause it to be re-sold by public auction or private sale and the defaulting buyer shall pay to Noonans any resulting deficiency in the 'total amount due' (after deduction of any part payment and addition of re-sale costs) and any surplus shall belong to the seller.

'deliberate forgery' was by means of scientific processes not generally accepted for use until after publication of the catalogue or a process which was unreasonably expensive or impractical.

- (c) A buyer's claim under this Condition shall be limited to any amount paid in respect of the lot and shall not extend to any loss or damage suffered or expense incurred by him or her.
- (d) The benefit of the Condition shall not be assignable and shall rest solely and exclusively in the buyer who, for the purpose of this condition, shall be and only be the person to whom the original invoice is made out by Noonans in respect of the lot sold.

14 Warranty of title and availability

The seller warrants to Noonans and to the buyer that he or she is the true owner of the property or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims. The seller will indemnify Noonans, its servants and agents and the buyer against any loss or damage suffered by either in consequence of any breach on the part of the seller.

15 Reserves

The seller shall be entitled to place, prior to the first day of the auction, a reserve at or below the low estimate on any lot provided that the low estimate is more than £100. Such reserve being the minimum 'hammer price' at which that lot may be treated as sold. A reserve once placed by the seller shall not be changed without the consent of Noonans. Noonans may at their option sell at a 'hammer price' below the reserve but in any such cases the sale proceeds to which the seller is entitled shall be the same as they would have been had the sale been at the reserve. Where a reserve has been placed, only the auctioneer may bid on behalf of the seller.

16 Authority to deduct commission and expenses

17 Rescission of sale

'total amount due' from the buyer. If circumstances do not permit Noonans to take instructions from the seller, the seller authorises Noonans at the seller's expense to agree special terms for payment of the 'total amount due', to remove, store and insure the lot sold, to settle claims made by or against the buyer on such terms as Noonans shall in its absolute discretion think fit, to take such steps as are necessary to collect monies due by the buyer to the seller and if necessary to rescind the sale and refund money to the buyer if appropriate.

20 If, notwithstanding that, the buyer fails to pay to Noonans the 'total amount due' within 35 days after the auction and Noonans remits the 'sale proceeds' to the seller, the ownership of the lot shall pass to Noonans.

21 Charges for withdrawn lots

- 26 Any representation or statement by Noonans, in any catalogue as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his or her own judgement as to such matters and neither Noonans nor its servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions.
- 27 Whilst the interests of prospective buyers are best served by attendance at the auction, Noonans will, if so instructed, execute bids on their behalf. Neither Noonans nor its servants or agents are responsible for any neglect or default in doing so or for failing to do so.
- 28 Noonans shall have the right, at its discretion, to refuse admission to its premises or attendance at its auctions by any person.
- 29 Noonans has absolute discretion without giving any reason to refuse any bid, to divide any lot, to combine any two or more lots, to withdraw any lot from the auction and in case of dispute to put

up any lot for auction again.

- 30 (a) Any indemnity under these Conditions shall extend to all actions, proceedings costs, expenses, claims and demands whatever incurred or suffered by the person entitled to the benefit of the indemnity. (b) Noonans declares itself to be a trustee for its relevant servants and agents of the benefit of every indemnity under these Conditions to the extent that such indemnity is expressed to be for the benefit of its servants and agents.
- 31 Any notice by Noonans to a seller, consignor, prospective bidder or buyer may be given by first class mail, airmail or email and if so given shall be deemed to have been duly received by the addressee within 48 hours.
- 32 These Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law. All transactions to which these Conditions apply and all matters connected therewith shall also be governed by English law. Noonans hereby submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts and all other parties concerned hereby submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

33 In these Conditions:

- (a) 'catalogue' includes any advertisement, brochure, estimate, price list or other publication;
- (b) 'hammer price' means the price at which a lot is knocked down by the auctioneer to the buyer;
- (c) 'total amount due' means the 'hammer price' in respect of the lot sold together with any premium, Value Added Tax chargeable and additional charges and expenses due from a defaulting buyer in pounds sterling;
- (d) 'deliberate forgery' means an imitation made with the intention of deceiving as to authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source which is not shown to be such in the description in the catalogue and which at the date of the sale had a value materially less than it would have had if it had been in accordance with that description;
