- 2001 NERVII, Vercio**, bronze Unit, lion standing right, *ve[rc]io* around, rev. horse standing right, four-spoked wheel above, *VERCIO* around, 5.38g/7h (DT 627; LT 8780). *Dark brown patina, very fine for type* £100-£150



- 2002 ARMORICA, Coriosolites**, billon Stater, class II, Ogmios and V-Boar type, head of Armorican sun-god right, pointed nose, three large rolls of hair, almond shaped eye, rev. horse right, v-form boar below, 6.42g/3h (DT 2340; LT 6598; Rybot 32, group II; Hooker 90). *Flan of unusual shape, otherwise bright, defined and good very fine* £120-£150

Provenance: C. Rudd 'War Coins of the Sun Warriors', p. 29, J, *this coin*; C. Rudd, Auction 183, 13 June 2022, lot 1

Rudd notes that "the unusual sprue on this superb, virtually-as-minted, war stater suggests that the flan was cast before being struck, evidence perhaps of an emergency issue".

- 2005 CANTII**, cast Potin Unit, Angular Bull type, outlined head right, rev. outline of bull, pellet in centre, 1.47g (ABC 171; BMC 686-97; VA 129-1; S 63). *Dark patina, very fine but some surface deposit, particularly on obverse* £20-£30



- 2006 ATREBATES and REGNI, Commios** (c. 50-25 BC), silver Minim, Moon Head type, moon head left, curved ladder for hair, two concentric rings in front between annulets, rev. horse advancing left, pellet in annulet above and below, 0.26g (ABC 1043; BMC 759-60; VA 358-5; S 70). *Very fine and rare* £100-£120

- 2007 ICENI**, Uninscribed issues, silver Units (2), Bury Diadem type, diademed female head left, corded curls for hair, snake in front, 0.97g/6h (ABC 1495; BMC 3524-7; VA 80-1; S 432); Norfolk Boar Star type, boar right, stack of pellets below, pelleted exergue, rev. horse right, three pellets above, star below, 0.88g/12h (ABC 1579; BMC 3445-54; VA 655-1; S 431) [2]. *Good fine and nearly fine* £100-£120

- 2009 ICENI**, Uninscribed issues, silver Unit, Norfolk God [Moustache] type, stylised male head right, dashes for hair, rev. horse right, arc above, lozenge below with concave sides, 1.29g/7h (ABC 1567; BMC 3605-3759; VA 792-1; S 434). *Attractive dark toning, very fine* £90-£120



- 2010 ICENI**, Uninscribed issues, a contemporary plated imitation of a silver Unit, Crescent Corn Ears type, opposing crescents and pellet in ring motifs at centre of four corn ears, pellet triad in each quarter, rev. curvy horse left, six-spoked wheel above, pellet-in-ring below, 0.90g (cf. ABC 1591; cf. BMC 3767-74; cf. VA 675-1; cf. S 435). *Some breaks in plating, otherwise better than very fine and toned* £30-£40

AD 10-30), silver Unit, Antd D-Bar type, double crescent emblem on vertical wreath, rev. horse right, corn-ear mane, trefoil on shoulder, reversed s below head, pellet triad and row of three pellets below horse, pelletal sun above, ANTD monogram below, 0.94g (ABC 1645; BMC 3960-409; VA 711-1; S 441). *Good fine, reverse significantly better, toned* £90-£120

- 2012 ICENI, Antedios** (c. AD 10-30), silver Unit, Antd D-Bar type, two opposed crescents on wreath, rev. horse right, reversed s below head, corn-ear mane, ANTD monogram below, 1.05g (ABC 1645; BMC 3800-4025; VA 711-1; S 441); **Ecen** (c. AD 10-43), silver Unit, Edn type, two opposed crescents on wreath, rev. horse right, three pellets and [EDN] below, 1.33g (ABC 1672; BMC 4223-81; VA 734-1; S 444) [2]. *Nearly very fine* £120-£150

- 2013 CORIELTAUVI**, Uninscribed issues, South Ferriby type, devolved head of Apollo, in the form of a wreath, cloak and crescents, rev. lunate horse left, 'anchor' face above, star sun below, 3.91g/12h (ABC 1743; BMC 3148-78; VA 811-1; S 390). *Broken, otherwise good fine* £100-£150



- 2014 TRINOVANTES, Dubnovellaunos** (5 BC - AD 10), gold Quarter-Stater, Trefoil type, wreath, two opposed crescents in centre, ringed pellet either side, rev. horse prancing left, trefoil above, branch and pellet below, ringed pellets behind, 1.34g (Sills class 1, 541; cf. ABC 2395; BMC 2442; VA 1660-1; S 208). *Struck a little off-centre, otherwise about very fine, rare* £200-£260

- 2016** Sceatta, Primary series BX, type 26, diademed and draped bust right within beaded circle, pseudo-legend around, *rev.* bird on cross, flanked by annulets, pseudo-legend around, 1.14g/11h (SCBI Abramson 42; Abramson 15-10; N 124; S 776). *Good fine, dark patina* £80-£100



- 2017** Sceatta, Primary series BII, diademed head right within clockwise beaded ouroboros, pseudo-legend around, *rev.* bird right on cross, annulets by horizontal cross limbs, all within clockwise beaded ouroboros, pseudo-legend around, 1.11g/9h (SCBI Abramson 55; Abramson 16-40; N 126; S 777). *Good fine, dark patina with some porosity* £300-£360

- 2018** Sceatta, Primary series BI, type 27b, diademed head right, clockwise beaded ouroboros around, pseudo-legend without, *rev.* bird right on cross, annulets by horizontal cross limbs, clockwise beaded ouroboros around, pseudo-legend without, 1.04g/12h (SCBI Abramson 53; Abramson 16-20; N 126; S 777). *Good fine with some roughness* £70-£90



- 2019** Sceatta, Primary series F, head right with pelleted helmet, pseudo-legend of strokes *x*s and *v*s around, *rev.* small cross-on-steps, annulets and pellets around, 1.06g (SCBI Abramson 110; N 62; S 781). *Good fine, some roughness and dented on obverse* £100-£120



- 2020** Sceatta, Continental Series E, Secondary type, sub-variety I, porcupine-like figure enclosing III and two pellets, annulet 'head', *rev.* debased standard containing an annulet, three lines and three pellets, 1.05g (SCBI Abramson –; Abramson –; cf. S 790D). *Light surface deposits, otherwise better than very fine* £90-£120

This appears a new variety with the dies not recorded in Abramson, Metcalf or Op den Velde. However, Series E Sceattas are the most diverse of the early Anglo-Saxon series and new designs frequently appear.



- 2021** Sceatta, Continental Series E, Secondary type, sub-variety I, porcupine-like figure enclosing retrograde III , 'head' terminating in a pellet, *rev.* debased standard containing an annulet, a cross and two L-shapes, annulets surrounding standard, 0.93g (SCBI Abramson –; Abramson –; cf. S 790D). *Very fine and prettily toned* £100-£150

- 2022** Sceatta, Continental series D, disintegrating bust right with flat 'crown', chevron-barred A behind, pyramid-like device before, *rev.* cross, pellets in angles, pseudo-legend around, 1.00g/3h (cf. SCBI Abramson 163; Abramson 8-10; N 168; S 792). *Good very fine, heavily stylised* £200-£260

- 2023** Sceatta, Secondary series G [Quentovic], type 3a, head right with double diadem, and short cross in field close to pouting lips rev. degraded standard containing three crosses, trefoil and two pellets arranged around central annulet, 0.94g (SCBI Abramson 321; Abramson 21-20; S 800). *Very fine, a hint of porosity* £90-£120



- 2024** Sceatta, Secondary series J, type 84, diademed head right, rev. bird right on cross, no pellets in front of bird, annulet either side, 1.05/9h (SCBI Abramson –; Abramson 18-20; N 128; S 802). *Obverse off-centre and with light surface marks, the reverse better than very fine* £90-£120

- 2025** Sceatta, Secondary series J [York], type 37, two heads vis-à-vis, cross and 'trident' between them, rev. whorl of four birds in linear style around central cross, 0.96g (SCBI Abramson 386ff; Abramson 19-30; N 135; S 802A). *Good fine, a little roughness* £120-£150

Kings of Northumbria



- 2026 Eanred**, Phase I, Styca, Cynwulf, EANRED REX around pellet, rev. CYNWVLF around pellet, 1.02g/6h (SCBI Lyon 68-9; N 186; S 860). *Nearly very fine, dark patina* £80-£100

H. Haigh, 1845 pl. 1, 10, *this coin*; Pagan, BNJ 1982, p. 66, *this coin*; N –; S 950). *Long ago broken, otherwise very fine, excessively rare and with exceptional pedigree*

Naismith lists only two examples of this type by this moneyer, one which formed part of the Briggs and Bascom cabinets and another which formed the Kenyon collection. The Bascom cataloguer described that coin as having been 'fractured and repaired' and gives the weight as 18.75 grains [1.21g]. The same coin was simply described as 'fine' in the Briggs catalogue and we can assume that the damage and subsequent restoration occurred between 1893 and 1914.

Unfortunately, the coin in question was not illustrated in either sale. However, our coin's identical weight and corresponding condition allow us to be confident in recognising it as the Bascom coin.

Hugh Pagan (BNJ 52, p.66-7) allowed the possibility that the Bascom coin was also one and the same as that offered as part of Joseph Kenyon's Collection in 1851, with the caveat that their respective auction catalogue descriptions differ in relation to the placement of pellets in the obverse legend. Fortunately for our purposes, the Kenyon specimen was illustrated (in the form of a line drawing) in Haigh's *An essay on the numismatic history of the ancient kingdom of the East Angles*. Our coin is certainly struck from the same reverse die as the Kenyon coin (note the filled 'E' at the end of the moneyer's name) whilst the arrangement of pellets on the obverse is seemingly identical. One final feature of note is that the line drawing is explicit in showing the reverse of Kenyon's coins as being struck slightly off-centre of the reverse, resulting in a small lip of extra metal beyond the beaded border running from around 10 to 2 o'clock and the loss of the beaded border off the bottom of the coin. The same feature arrangement is to be found on our coin, although somewhat obscured by its subsequent repair.

We must imagine therefore that the Bascom cataloguer simply slipped when he described the coin's obverse, and that in all of these instances the same, unique coin is being described.

The medal was presented on the opening of a library in the Indian town of Vinchur, near Nashik in Maharashtra. The opening was presided over by Arthur Mason Tippetts Jackson, a British officer in the Indian Civil Service who, unlike many of his countrymen held India and its inhabitants in high esteem. A lover of Indian culture and history and a student of Sanskrit, he was highly regarded and known locally as 'Pandit Jackson'. It is surprising then, that a few months after this medal was engraved he was shot at close range by an Indian Freedom Fighter, Anant Laxman Kanhere in a theatre in Nashik at a performance of the Narathi drama 'Sharada' held in Jackson's honour. His role as a Magistrate led local revolutionaries to target him in revenge for prosecuting one of their number, notwithstanding his unusually sympathetic attitude towards their country and culture.

The ownership of the lot(s) purchased shall not pass to the buyer until he or she has made payment in full to Noonans of the 'total amount due' in pounds sterling.

10 (a) The buyer shall at his or her own expense take away the lot(s) purchased not later than 5 working days after the day of the auction but (unless credit terms have been agreed in accordance with Condition 7) not before payment to Noonans of the 'total amount due'.

(b) The buyer shall be responsible for any removal, storage and insurance charges on any lot not taken away within 5 working days after the day of the auction.

(c) The packing and handling of purchased lots by Noonans staff is undertaken solely as a courtesy to clients and, in the case of fragile articles, will be undertaken only at Noonans' discretion. In no event will Noonans be liable for damage to glass or frames, regardless of the cause. Bulky lots or sharp implements, etc., may not be suitable for in-house shipping.

11 Buyers' responsibilities for lots purchased

The buyer will be responsible for loss or damage to lots purchased from the time of collection or the expiry of 5 working days after the day of the auction, whichever is the sooner. Neither Noonans nor its servants or agents shall thereafter be responsible for any loss or damage of any kind, whether caused by negligence or otherwise, while any lot is in its custody or under its control.

Loss and damage warranty cover at the rate of 1.5% will be applied to any lots despatched by Noonans to destinations outside the UK, unless specifically instructed otherwise by the consignee.

12 Remedies for non-payment or failure to collect purchase

If any lot is not paid for in full and taken away in accordance with Conditions 6 and 10, or if there is any other breach of either of those Conditions, Noonans as agent of the seller shall, at its absolute discretion and without prejudice to any other rights it may have, be entitled to exercise one or

more of the following rights and remedies:

- (a) to proceed against the buyer for damages for breach of contract.
- (b) to rescind the sale of that or any other lots sold to the defaulting buyer at the same or any other auction.
- (c) to re-sell the lot or cause it to be re-sold by public auction or private sale and the defaulting buyer shall pay to Noonans any resulting deficiency in the 'total amount due' (after deduction of any part payment and addition of re-sale costs) and any surplus shall belong to the seller.
- (d) to remove, store and insure the lot at the expense of the defaulting buyer and, in the case of storage, either at Noonans' premises or elsewhere.
- (e) to charge interest at a rate not exceeding 2 percent per month on the 'total amount due' to the extent it remains unpaid for more than 5 working days after the day of the auction.
- (f) to retain that or any other lot sold to the same buyer at the sale or any other auction and release it only after payment of the 'total amount due'.
- (g) to reject or ignore any bids made by or on behalf of the defaulting buyer at any future auctions or obtaining a deposit before accepting any bids in future.
- (h) to apply any proceeds of sale then due or at any time thereafter becoming due to the defaulting buyer towards settlement of the 'total amount due' and to exercise a lien on any property of the defaulting buyer which is in Noonans' possession for any purpose.

13 Liability of Noonans and sellers

(a) Goods auctioned are usually of some age. All goods are sold with all faults and imperfections and errors of description. Illustrations in catalogues are for identification only. Buyers should satisfy themselves prior to the sale as to the condition of each lot and should exercise and rely on their own judgement as to whether the lot accords with its description. Subject to the obligations accepted by Noonans under this Condition, none of the seller, Noonans, its servants or agents is responsible for errors of descriptions or for the genuineness or authenticity of any lot. No warranty whatever is given by Noonans, its servants or agents, or any seller to any buyer in respect of any lot and any express or implied conditions or warranties are hereby excluded.

(b) Any lot which proves to be a 'deliberate forgery' may be returned by the buyer to Noonans within 15 days of the date of the auction in the same condition in which it was at the time of the auction, accompanied by a statement of defects, the number of the lot, and the date of the auction at which it was purchased. If Noonans is satisfied that the item is a 'deliberate forgery' and that the buyer has and is able to transfer a good and marketable title to the lot free from any third party claims, the sale will be set aside and any amount paid in respect of the lot will be refunded, provided that the buyer shall have no rights under this Condition if:

- (i) the description in the catalogue at the date of the sale was in accordance with the then generally accepted opinion of scholars and experts or fairly indicated that there was a conflict of such opinion; or
- (ii) the only method of establishing at the date of publication of the catalogue that the lot was a

'deliberate forgery' was by means of scientific processes not generally accepted for use until after publication of the catalogue or a process which was unreasonably expensive or impractical.

(c) A buyer's claim under this Condition shall be limited to any amount paid in respect of the lot and shall not extend to any loss or damage suffered or expense incurred by him or her.

(d) The benefit of the Condition shall not be assignable and shall rest solely and exclusively in the buyer who, for the purpose of this condition, shall be and only be the person to whom the original invoice is made out by Noonans in respect of the lot sold.

CONDITIONS MAINLY CONCERNING SELLERS AND CONSIGNORS

14 Warranty of title and availability

The seller warrants to Noonans and to the buyer that he or she is the true owner of the property or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claims. The seller will indemnify Noonans, its servants and agents and the buyer against any loss or damage suffered by either in consequence of any breach on the part of the seller.

15 Reserves

The seller shall be entitled to place, prior to the first day of the auction, a reserve at or below the low estimate on any lot provided that the low estimate is more than £100. Such reserve being the minimum 'hammer price' at which that lot may be treated as sold. A reserve once placed by the seller shall not be changed without the consent of Noonans. Noonans may at their option sell at a 'hammer price' below the reserve but in any such cases the sale proceeds to which the seller is entitled shall be the same as they would have been had the sale been at the reserve. Where a reserve has been placed, only the auctioneer may bid on behalf of the seller.

16 Authority to deduct commission and expenses

The seller authorises Noonans to deduct commission at the 'stated rate' and 'expenses' from the 'hammer price' and acknowledges Noonans' right to retain the premium payable by the buyer.

17 Rescission of sale

If before Noonans remit the 'sale proceeds' to the seller, the buyer makes a claim to rescind the sale that is appropriate and Noonans is of the opinion that the claim is justified, Noonans is authorised to rescind the sale and refund to the buyer any amount paid to Noonans in respect of the lot.

18 Payment of sale proceeds

Noonans shall remit the 'sale proceeds' to the seller 35 days after the auction, but if by that date Noonans has not received the 'total amount due' from the buyer then Noonans will remit the sale proceeds within five working days after the date on which the 'total amount due' is received from the buyer. If credit terms have been agreed between Noonans and the buyer, Noonans shall remit to the seller the sale proceeds 35 days after the auction unless otherwise agreed by the seller.

19 If the buyer fails to pay to Noonans the 'total amount due' within 35 days after the auction, Noonans will endeavour to notify the seller and take the seller's instructions as to the appropriate course of action and, so far as in Noonans' opinion is practicable, will assist the seller to recover the

'total amount due' from the buyer. If circumstances do not permit Noonans to take instructions from the seller, the seller authorises Noonans at the seller's expense to agree special terms for payment of the 'total amount due', to remove, store and insure the lot sold, to settle claims made by or against the buyer on such terms as Noonans shall in its absolute discretion think fit, to take such steps as are necessary to collect monies due by the buyer to the seller and if necessary to rescind the sale and refund money to the buyer if appropriate.

20 If, notwithstanding that, the buyer fails to pay to Noonans the 'total amount due' within 35 days after the auction and Noonans remits the 'sale proceeds' to the seller, the ownership of the lot shall pass to Noonans.

21 Charges for withdrawn lots

Where a seller cancels instructions for sale, Noonans reserve the right to charge a fee of 15% of Noonans' then latest middle estimate of the auction price of the property withdrawn, together with Value Added Tax thereon if the seller is resident in the UK, and 'expenses' incurred in relation to the property.

22 Rights to photographs and illustrations

The seller gives Noonans full and absolute right to photograph and illustrate any lot placed in its hands for sale and to use such photographs and illustrations and any photographs and illustrations provided by the seller at any time at its absolute discretion (whether or not in connection with the auction).

23 Unsold lots

Where any lot fails to sell, Noonans shall notify the seller accordingly. The seller shall make arrangements either to re-offer the lot for sale or to collect the lot.

24 Noonans reserve the right to charge commission up to one-half of the 'stated rates' calculated on the 'bought-in price' and in addition 'expenses' in respect of any unsold lots.

GENERAL CONDITIONS AND DEFINITIONS

25 Noonans sells as agent for the seller (except where it is stated wholly or partly to own any lot as principal) and as such is not responsible for any default by seller or buyer.

26 Any representation or statement by Noonans, in any catalogue as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his or her own judgement as to such matters and neither Noonans nor its servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions.

27 Whilst the interests of prospective buyers are best served by attendance at the auction, Noonans will, if so instructed, execute bids on their behalf. Neither Noonans nor its servants or agents are responsible for any neglect or default in doing so or for failing to do so.

28 Noonans shall have the right, at its discretion, to refuse admission to its premises or attendance at its auctions by any person.

29 Noonans has absolute discretion without giving any reason to refuse any bid, to divide any lot, to combine any two or more lots, to withdraw any lot from the auction and in case of dispute to put

up any lot for auction again.

30 (a) Any indemnity under these Conditions shall extend to all actions, proceedings costs, expenses, claims and demands whatever incurred or suffered by the person entitled to the benefit of the indemnity.

(b) Noonans declares itself to be a trustee for its relevant servants and agents of the benefit of every indemnity under these Conditions to the extent that such indemnity is expressed to be for the benefit of its servants and agents.

31 Any notice by Noonans to a seller, consignor, prospective bidder or buyer may be given by first class mail, airmail or email and if so given shall be deemed to have been duly received by the addressee within 48 hours.

32 These Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law. All transactions to which these Conditions apply and all matters connected therewith shall also be governed by English law. Noonans hereby submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts and all other parties concerned hereby submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

33 In these Conditions:

(a) 'catalogue' includes any advertisement, brochure, estimate, price list or other publication;

(b) 'hammer price' means the price at which a lot is knocked down by the auctioneer to the buyer;

(c) 'total amount due' means the 'hammer price' in respect of the lot sold together with any premium, Value Added Tax chargeable and additional charges and expenses due from a defaulting buyer in pounds sterling;

(d) 'deliberate forgery' means an imitation made with the intention of deceiving as to authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source which is not shown to be such in the description in the catalogue and which at the date of the sale had a value materially less than it would have had if it had been in accordance with that description;

(e) 'sale proceeds' means the net amount due to the seller being the 'hammer price' of the lot sold less commission at the 'stated rates' and 'expenses' and any other amounts due to Noonans by the seller in whatever capacity and howsoever arising;

(f) 'stated rate' means Noonans' published rates of commission for the time and any Value Added Tax thereon;

(g) 'expenses' in relation to the sale of any lot means Noonans charges and expenses for insurance, illustrations, special advertising, certification, remedials, packing and freight of that lot and any Value Added Tax thereon;

(h) 'bought-in price' means 5 per cent more than the highest bid received below the reserve.

34 Vendors' commission of sales

A commission of 15% is payable by the vendor on the hammer price on lots sold.

Insurance is charged at 1.5% of the hammer price.

35 VAT

Commission, illustrations, insurance and expenses are subject to VAT if the seller is resident in the UK.
